The Hidden Valley Community Association serves the residents living within the geographic area of Hidden Valley and Hanson Ranch. HVCA is a Not for Profit Society that holds an LOC (license of occupation) with the City of Calgary for the Hidden Hut & rink facility. Sources of ongoing funding are from internal operational initiatives such as membership fees and program revenues as well as casinos and grants. This organization is governed by a Board whose structure and term is set out in their By-laws. The Board meets and does reporting, on a regular monthly basis, along with a scheduled AGM (Annual General Meeting).

ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY

Hidden Valley is a young community with its first house built in 1991. In May 1994, the beginnings of the Hidden Valley Community Association were being formed as a small group of individuals formed a Steering Committee who were elected 'at large' to work on issues as presented and others as arise. This group represented concerns and addressed community issues.

The Hidden Valley Community Association was established in 1995. The Board completed Community Facility Enhancement Program Grant application, which saw the development of baseball diamonds, soccer fields, tennis courts, play structures and an ice skating rink.

The first Visioning Workshop held in March of 1995, since then the HVCA has continued to work together to remain relevant to the residents of Hidden Valley and Hanson Ranch. Currently, Hidden Valley/Hanson Ranch has grown to approximately 3900 homes.
